Zerihun Tadele holds PhD from the University of Basel in Switzerland, MSc from Haramava University and BSc from Addis Ababa University. He did his habilitation at the University of Bern in Switzerland. At the present time, he is a Group Leader at the Institute of Plant Sciences, University of Bern and Adjunct Associate Professor at Addis Ababa University, Institute of Biotechnology. He is also a member of CDE (Center for Development and Environment) at the University of Bern. His current research focuses on tackling major yield limiting factors in tef (*Eragrostis tef*), a cereal crop of major importance in Ethiopia where it is annually cultivated on about 3 million ha of land and is a staple food for over 60 million people. His group implements agronomic, genetic and genomic tools to develop tef cultivars with desirable traits. Zerihun has won the 2013 Maag Prize in Switzerland and the 2015 Swiss International Agricultural Research Award.
